**GENERAL ORDER**

This General Order is being issued in response to the continued community transmission of the Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19) throughout the United States and specifically the Western District of Missouri and supersedes the General Order entered on December 1, 2020. The outbreak of COVID-19 continues to be a public health crisis requiring the Court to take extraordinary steps to prevent the spread of the virus. In light of the continued severity of the outbreak, the Court continues to conclude it cannot draw a venire panel, select a jury, or try a case to completion in a manner consistent with the parties' rights to a fair cross-section of the community or due process. Therefore, it is ORDERED that:

1. Effective immediately, all civil and criminal petit jury selections and jury trials scheduled to commence before any district or magistrate judge in the Western District of Missouri between today and May 3, 2021 are hereby CONTINUED;
2. All cases set on the February 8 and March 22, 2021 Joint Criminal Jury Trial Dockets, where no motion for continuance is filed by the current trial setting, will be CONTINUED to the Joint Criminal Jury Trial Docket of May 3, 2021. In granting this continuance, the Court finds that health concerns related to COVID-19 dictate that gatherings of people be limited, which counsels against summoning jurors for jury service. Moreover, prospective jurors may be reluctant to jeopardize their health and appear under these circumstances, which will hamper the Court's ability to ensure that a fair cross section of the community is summoned. These realities negatively impact the fair administration of justice and the rights of

defendants; those interests and concerns, coupled with the public health interests at stake, outweigh the interests of each defendant's right to and the public's interest in a speedy trial. Accordingly, pursuant to 18 U.S.C. § 3161(h)(7)(A), the time period of continuances through May 14, 2021 shall be excluded when computing the time within which trial must commence.

3. Criminal matters before magistrate judges, such as initial appearances, arraignments, detention hearings, and the issuance of warrants, will continue to take place in the ordinary course. At the discretion of the judge, such hearings may be conducted in person or via video conference.
4. Individual judges will exercise their discretion in determining whether to hold non-emergency criminal and civil hearings, conferences, and bench trials in person or via video conference.
5. Bankruptcy dockets, hearings, and trials through May 3, 2021, will be conducted by telephone, Zoom, or continued based on the circumstances and in the discretion of the judge. At the discretion of the judge bankruptcy trials and evidentiary hearings may be conducted in person;
6. All courthouses and offices in the Western District of Missouri will remain open for business. The public counters at all locations are open to the public from 10:00 a.m to 2:00 p.m. These hours are subject to change without notice. Drop boxes are available in each courthouse for public filings. Electronic filings may still be made through CM/ECF. 7. This General Order is effective immediately.
