### **SPECIFICATIONS / STATEMENT OF WORK**

#### 1. BACKGROUND

The Court is requesting open market pricing for the acquisition, installation, and configuration of six (6) Crestron DM NVX 4K60 4:4:4 Network AV Encoder, or equivalent; six (6) Extron IN1606, or equivalent; six (6) Crestron DM NVX 4K60 4:4:4 HDR Network AV Decoder, or equivalent; and six (6) Extron annotator 401, or equivalent.

### 2. SCOPE/GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

- **2.1** Contractor must provider six (6) Crestron DM NVX 4K60 4:4:4 Network AV Encoder, or equivalent; six (6) Extron IN1606, or equivalent; six (6) Crestron DM NVX 4K60 4:4:4 HDR Network AV Decoder, or equivalent; and six (6) Extron annotator 401, or equivalent. In addition, the contractor must be able to migrate the configuration settings from the old system to the new.
- **2.2** Court Information Technology (IT) personnel will perform acceptance testing in the presence of the contractor. (See Section 4.4.)
- **2.3** Contractor must remove the retired equipment, if any, and related components in such a fashion as to preserve the operability of each component. Removed equipment remains the property of the government.
- **2.5** Contractor must demonstrate at least three years of comparable field experience installing and configuring AV systems.

### 3.4 - Acceptance Testing

#### 4. ENVIRONMENT

The contractor shall ensure that only properly certified installers perform the duties associated with installation and configuration of the new system.

#### 4.1 – Location for Performance

The location for delivery and performance will be 400 E. 9<sup>th</sup> St., Kansas City, MO 64106. Prior to delivery and installation, the contractor will attend a Kickoff Meeting either in person or via teleconference to finalize the details and address any questions or concerns related to schedule, shipping, and installation.

### **5.2** – **Security**

All contractor personnel must provide photo I.D. before entering the courthouse. All contractor personnel must be escorted by Court personnel throughout every area of the courthouse.

#### 5.3 – Contractor Furnished Material

The equipment, including all connectors, cables, cords, and ancillary parts necessary for completion of this contract shall be provided by the contractor.

#### 6. PERIOD OF PERFORMANCE

The overall period of performance for this contract will be 60 days from the date the contract is signed by the government. See Section 4.1 for detailed breakdown of anticipated schedule for delivery and installation.

#### 7. PAYMENT
